Experience

I have worked for Helping Hands for over ten years now, beginning my career here working as part-time Carer. I very quickly developed a passion for the elderly and their wellbeing, which instigated my decision to give up my previous role as a HR Consultant in order to pursue care on a full time basis. I believe very strongly in the Helping Hands values, and I can honestly say the training I received is second to none. The support is continual, with a team who are on hand to help and guide in any situation.

I have experience of working with both younger and elderly customers. My mother was elderly, so I am familiar with the age-related frailties and illnesses people of that age may face. As my mother's primary caregiver, I was able to develop an ability to observe signs and symptoms of conditions such as Stroke, Diabetes, and water infections, and how dangerous they can be if they are not dealt with effectively. I also cared for my partner's mother living with Bowel Cancer, requiring stoma care and Warfarin administration. These personal experiences allow me to relate and empathise with both customers and their families who find themselves in very vulnerable positions.

You would not believe how much I love my work here at Helping Hands; to me, it is not a job, it is supporting and working alongside healthcare professionals in order to make a positive difference in the lives of others, enabling them to remain living independently in their own homes.
